The main objective of these funds are to help offset the current short-term operational expenses, unexpected emergency expenses such as the new heating system last year, and to help provide for the growth of our future.

She became a member of the First Presbyterian Church in the early 2000's where she not only sang in the choir but wrote a report calling for gender equality throughout the presbytery while she was a member of Session. Being born to a missionary family while living in Iran, Beth had a global perspective and appreciation of the World. She was independent, very active in gender equality and women's rights, loved the earth with her organic ideas and was a devoted mother and wife. She is survived by her sister, 3 children, and 4 grandchildren. A memorial celebration of Beth's life is being planned for this summer. We are so blessed to have had the life of Beth among us.

Carolyn was born in Pottstown, PA, graduated from Wilson College, and earned a Master's degree in Social Work from Western Reserve University.
