This highlight for Tower Tidings is written to update the congregation on the work of the Session in March 2024.

Session met on March 27, 2024 and heard reports from each of the coordinating teams. Pastor Rice reminded Session that the deadline to apply for the ReKindle grant offered by Columbia Theological Seminary is April 30. Session will continue to consider applying for a grant to fund a revisioning project. Jeff Perkins reported for the Resource Development Ministry that the church has received a generous gift from the estate of Don Beane.

Amy Baxtrom sent an update on her progress toward Christian Educator Certification. She has held two multi-generational Sunday School classes on spiritual practices, each attended by about 30 children, youth, and adults. Four more classes planned for April.

Tim Hall sent a report about the status of the church's physical plant. Repairs have been made to the elevator and adjustments made to the sound system. Sealing and striping of the parking lot will be scheduled soon.

Mimi Lewellen reported that the Nominating Committee has completed its work and will present a slate of candidates for elder and deacon at the annual meeting on May 5. The annual meeting will be preceded by a potluck with a Cinco de Mayo theme hosted by Faith & Nurture.

Members of Session will continue to meet on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month at 7:00 p.m., with the exception of April 2024 when there will be no Session meeting. ### A Mission Support Opportunity

First Pres member Emma LoGiudice, a nursing major at Ohio Northern University, will be returning to the Dominican Republic in May to serve once again with Nurses Without Borders.

Northern Nursing Without Borders is a group of nursing, pharmacy, allied health, and other students, along with alumni and faculty, who travel to San Juan de la Maguana, Dominican Republic, to operate medical clinics in surrounding villages. During the clinics, team members obtain vital signs and

medical histories, facilitate visits with health care providers, fill needed prescriptions, and distribute donated items such as vitamins, hygiene supplies, shoes, clothes, toys, etc. During this year's trip, participants will also be staffing education stations for children and adults on the topics of oral hygiene, handwashing, cough etiquette, UTI prevention, and self-breast

### Nurses Without Borders Items Needed:

Items needed for hygiene kits: Cloth drawstring bags, Bars of soap, Washcloths, Dishcloths, Scrubbies, Deodorant, Q-Tips, Hand sanitizer, Baby wipes, Diapers, Lotion, Toothbrushes, Toothpaste, Mouthwash, Floss, Combs/Shampoo, Conditioner.

OTC Medications: Acetaminophen - reg/xtra strength, Ibuprofen, Naproxen, Children's + Infant's Acetaminophen suspension, Children's + Infant Ibuprofen suspension, Children's chewable Acetaminophen, Children's chewable Ibuprofen, Acetaminophen infant rectal suppositories, Prenatal vitamins, Adult vitamins, Children's vitamins, Children's Liquid Multivitamin, Vitamin B, Folic Acid, C, D Iron Supplement, Guaifenesin (Mucinex adult cold medicine), Kid's cold medicine, Diphenhydramine (Benadryl) tablets, Diphenhydramine (Benadryl) liquid, Allergy Medications, Famotidine 20mg, Exomeprazole tablets 20mg, Tums/Antacids, Anti-diarrheal meds.

First Aid Items: Band Aids, Gauze pads/sponges (Sterile 2 pack), Chapstick.


Diabetes Support: Glucometers with test strips and batteries, Lancets.

Storage and Containers: Brown paper bags, Plastic trash bags for barrio clinics, Plastic ziploc bags — small for pills, Plastic ziploc bags — snack size, Plastic ziploc bags — sandwich size, Plastic ziploc bags — gallon size, Pill bottles, empty and clean.

Miscellaneous: Pill Counter trays, Pill Cutters, Small plastic cups with lids, Pregnancy Test Kits, Reading glasses, Pens, Dumdum Suckers, Small Toys, Bracelets, Large suitcase with wheels.

### SPRING BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

You're invited to join a discussion of the book *The Meaning of Jesus: Two Visions* by Marcus Borg and N.T. Wright on Thursday evenings from April 11 – May 9. We'll meet from 7:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. in the church library.

Biblical scholars Borg and Wright present their widely divergent perspectives on important questions of the Christian faith including, "Did Jesus know he was the Messiah?", "Did he intentionally die to redeem humankind?", and "Was Jesus fully human and fully divine?" In each section the authors, who are long-time friends, present their opposing viewpoints on a question at the heart of the historical Jesus debate and invite the reader to draw his or her own conclusions.

*The Meaning of Jesus* is available for purchase online in paperback and electronic formats. At our first meeting on April 11, we'll discuss the Introduction and Chapters 1-2. 

### Our 150th Anniversary Mustard Seed Mission Project

As Westminster Presbyterian Church in Wooster, Ohio, celebrates its 150th anniversary in 2024, we invite your help as we reach outside our sanctuary walls to assist our neighbors in Wayne and adjacent counties. As disciples of Jesus, we believe in the promise of the mustard seed parable. Small actions, especially when caringly cultivated, can produce yields of amazing size. Imagine living in a community where every person profoundly experiences the life-transforming power of God's kin-dom: the strengthening of the fabric of the community as resources shared bless both the giver and the receiver! May this vision inspire your consideration and contribution to help erase the medical debt of those in our county and nearby.

**Every day 1 in 2 Americans** choose between paying medical bills and covering basic needs. Nearly 50% of U.S. adults delayed or skipped medical care due to the high cost. 50% of U.S. adults would not be able to afford an unexpected \$500 bill. 2/3 of bankruptcies cite medical debt as a leading cause. Please learn more about the RIP Medical Debt initiative below. Eligible medical debt within Wayne County and its surrounding communities can be greatly reduced or eliminated with your caring contribution.

#### Here is how it works:

When a contribution is made, RIP uses data analytics to pinpoint the debt of those most in need: households that earn less than 4 times the federal poverty level (varies by county and family size) or whose debts are 5% or more of annual income.
