Dear Friends,

The chill in the air is a brisk reminder that we are in the season of Advent and on our way to a joyous celebration of Christmas. It all begins this first weekend of December with the Downtown Historic Church Tour on Friday afternoon and evening that will bring our Wooster neighbors into our beautiful sanctuary. Then on this coming Sunday afternoon, First Pres will host the Alternative Gift Market in Bruch Hall. Festivities continue the following Sunday after church with our annual Holiday Potluck Lunch.

Our Sunday worship this month will feature an "Eventide-led" service on December 10, the children and youth Advent Celebration on December 17, the Christmas Eve Service of Lessons and Carols and Candlelight beginning at 6:45 on the 24th, and finish on the last Sunday of the year in our sanctuary with our friends from Westminster Presbyterian leading us in worship.

The days between Sundays include the fellowship of Mixed Company and Friday Fellowship and the special return concert this coming Saturday, December 2, by the much beloved Sonnenberg Station.

We are reminded to take notice that the new church pictorial directory is in the works. Individuals, couples, and families may upload a photo or have a picture taken at church in Bruch Hall. A photo opportunity will also be provided during the Holiday Potluck on December 10.

Finally, I draw your attention to the financial update provided by the Resource Development Ministry. We are invited to join in the support of our church and its mission, ministry, and fellowship by submitting a pledge card for the 2024 budget. No pledge amount is too small, and we are strengthened for the future by the participation of all. For those who are above the age of 70, the tax advantages of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from an IRA is well worth looking into.

Each of the four Sundays of Advent focuses on a theme that underscores the faith we have in a gracious and generous God: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love. May you experience these gifts as we journey through this time together and anticipate a new year dawning.

This highlight for Tower Tidings is written to update the congregation on the work of the Session in November 2023.

Session has been busy this month, responding to various notifications during the process of selling the property at 637 College Avenue. This sale was completed on 11.28.2023 and the bulk of the proceeds were used to pay off the loan that financed the new heating system in 2022. The Church will benefit from the savings from the cost of servicing the loan, as well as reduced building maintenance and insurance costs. Many thanks to the RDM team, especially Stu Miller, who worked very diligently to make this sale happen.

During the monthly meeting, members of Session heard reports from each of the coordinating teams. Many activities are planned for the Advent season, providing wonderful opportunities for worship and community together. Pastor David reported that he and several deacons recently offered communion to several members who are in care facilities. This sacrament is offered to all who request it, so please let the church office know if you or a loved one would like to receive it.

Session also heard an update from Women's Fellowship who has welcomed a new Leadership team and is working through a process of reorganization in order to continue to uphold the strong "pillars" of Fellowship, Service to First Presbyterian Church and Mission. This group has a strong history of service to the church family and community, for which we are all grateful.

Members of Session were reminded to participate in the new Photo Directory. The link to the information form and to upload a photo will continue to be in the weekly bulletins and News Flash publications as a reminder.

Eventide is a casual gathering for worship, reflection, and fellowship. Encouraging each other as we wrestle with what it means to live out our faith.






Celebrate the Season with Children's Music at FPC

A series of events took place in Alabama and throughout the South in the 1950s and 60s that culminated in the ultimate passage of the 1964 National Civil Rights Act and the 1965 National Voting Rights Act. On this five-day, four-night pilgrimage, you'll learn how each event, from the day in 1955 when Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat on a bus in Montgomery to the 1965 Selma to Montgomery March, moved the arc of the universe a little closer to justice.

On this Pilgrimage, you'll visit historic sites, walk about the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma, and meet unsung heroes and foot soldiers of the Civil Rights Movement. As a spiritual pilgrimage, we'll reflect on what we experience together so when we each return home, we can apply what we have learned to make a difference in today's world.

You'll also visit the Equal Justice Initiative's <u>Legacy Museum: From Enslavement to Mass Incarceration</u> and <u>National Memorial for Peace and Justice</u> in Montgomery. The museum provides a comprehensive history of the United States with a focus on the legacy of slavery and the memorial tells the story of racial terror lynching victims in the United States.
