Dear Friends,

As the days shorten and the light fades into winter shadow and a chill wind blows, we know we are coming to the end of a calendar year. We are also at the close of a liturgical year that has given us so many meaningful times of worship and contemplation and stories from the Gospel According to Luke. Now we stand at the dawn of Advent, a season of waiting and anticipation and hopeful expectation as we rehearse once again the mysterious story of Nativity, when the wonderous gift is given.

Thanksgiving weekend folds into the first of four Sundays of Advent. The Advent schedule in the Newsletter highlights some of the special offerings of this season. It all begins on Friday, December 5, with the annual Downtown Church Walk, allowing us to share our beautiful sanctuary with everyone in the Wooster community. The next day, Saturday, December 6 at 3:00 p.m., we host a seasonal concert given by the renowned Sonnenberg Station. And then Sunday, December 7, features a musical fable entitled "Brother Heinrich's Christmas," a joint dramatic presentation by our Sanctuary Choir and Children's Music program, followed by the Holiday Potluck in Bruch Hall. The following Sunday, December 14, brings the community-wide Alternative Gift Market back to First Presbyterian, a meaningful way to finish one's Christmas shopping that benefits so many non-profit organizations and communities around the world.

The juxtaposition of our Thanksgiving celebrations leading us into Advent underscores the central place that generous giving holds this time of year. Families sponsored by the Salvation Army hope to receive Christmas gifts from their wish lists, unused Christmas cards are provided to inmates in the Wooster jail to be sent to their family members, the Mitten Tree stands in the Gathering Area to receive warm gifts for those in need, gift certificates are offered by local entities to benefit our community. And even closer to home during this giving season, First Presbyterian continues its 2026 Financial Pledge Campaign as we anticipate a New Year full of opportunities for worship, fellowship, ministry, mission, and building rehabilitation for the generations that will come after us.

Perhaps there is nothing more for me to say other than "Happy Thanksgiving," and may you and your families and friends be well in body, mind, and spirit as the year closes and a new one peaks over the horizon.


In addition, we'll have goods from World Crafts of Kidron, fair trade coffee, and Ghanaian fabric products.

During this Wonderful Time of the Year, we are encouraging all of us to help protect our planet by reducing the amount of waste we produce during our celebrations.


Here are some of our suggestions



Holiday Light Recycling


Yes, it's that time of year when we unbox our Christmas decorations and determine how many of those strings of lights still work.

The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of FPC member Joyce Gerber who died on November 15, 2025. Joyce lived many places during her childhood due to her father's military service. She graduated from Clover Park High School in Tacoma, Washington and came to Wooster to live with her maternal grandmother. Joyce and her late husband Caleb were married in 1957. They lived for a time in Arizona but returned to Wayne County to take up dairy farming, owning first a farm in Smithville and later one in Dalton. After her children were grown, Joyce worked as an executive assistant at OSU Extension until retirement.

Joyce was active in the life of FPC, serving as a deacon and participating in First Friends, Mixed Company, Women's Fellowship, adult education, and book group. She had many interests and enjoyed gardening, reading, and travel. She also volunteered with hospice facilitating support groups for widows and was active in the Herb Society.

Joyce is survived by her children Mark and Julie, their spouses, and three grandchildren. She was predeceased by her husband Caleb and son Tim. A Celebration of Life service will be held at Salem Mennonite Church on December 20, 2025 at 2:00 p.m.



The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of former FPC member Roberta Curry who died September 21, 2025 in Gainesville, Florida. Roberta was born in Dayton, Ohio and earned both bachelor's and master's degrees in Home Economics from The Ohio State University. In 1955 she accepted a position as assistant professor of textiles and clothing at the University of Missouri, where she met her husband, Bruce. Roberta and Bruce were married in 1956 and moved to Wooster in 1960.

Roberta was an active member of FPC during her time in Wooster and served as an elder, deacon, and president and treasurer of Presbyterian Women. She was one of the inaugural members of the adult bell choir formed in 1965, and in 1970 she founded and directed the youth bell choir. She was also a Brownie and Girl Scout leader and president of the Wooster High School Band Parents. From 1973 to 1987 she was manager and sewing instructor at Knits Unlimited (later Fabrics Unlimited), a fabric store located immediately north of the church parking lot on Beall Ave.

Roberta and Bruce relocated to Florida in 1988 and were members of the First Presbyterian Church of Gainesville. She was an active handbell musician there until retiring in 2015 after 50 years of ringing.

Roberta is survived by her husband Bruce, daughter Elaine (Allen) Turner, four grandchildren, and one great-grandchild. She was preceded in death by her son Rob. A memorial service was held in Gainesville on November 13, 2025 with Rev. Dave Shull (son of Gordon and Betty) officiating.
