The most recent directory was completed in 2019 and was composed by a formal photography company. The 2024 directory will be created here at FPC using resources we already have.
















### **Adult Faith Formation Offerings**

### **Help UN-Decorate the Church**




While you've probably grown tired of seeing The Inflation Reduction Act talked about in the news - both good and bad - here are some of the benefits that individuals like us can still take advantage of. Did you know there is such as thing as a heat pump water heater? They are much more efficient than either a gas or traditional electric water heater.

Other items covered by the IRA include electric panel and electrical wiring upgrades, heat pump furnace/air conditioner, heat pump clothes dryer, efficiency rebates like insulation and windows, battery power backup storage, geothermal heating installation, EV charger, new and used electric vehicles, and rooftop solar panels.

If we need one of these appliances replaced in the near future, we will certainly be looking into them, and hope you will too. We put in solar panels with a lithium battery backup four years ago, and after the first winter, we haven't paid for any electricity (only the monthly service fee). And when the power does go out, we have sufficient battery backup to run what we need (not everything). It's been tested out a few times.

### Ric Sheffield Book Talk

### We Got By: A Black Family's Journey in the Heartland

"Life along the color line in rural Ohio was hard. Being Black often meant feeling frightened and alone. For a family like Ric S. Sheffield's, examining this reality closely meant confronting challenges and tragedies that often felt overwhelming, even as their odyssey also included the joyful and inspiring. Navigating day-to-day existence in a world where trusting white neighbors required a careful mixture of caution and faith, Sheffield and his kin existed in a space where they were both seen and unseen.

Spanning four generations and assessing the legacies of traumatic events (arrests, murders, suicide) that are inextricable from the racial dynamics of the small community his family called home, this gripping memoir is a heartfelt, clear-eyed, and rare chronicle of Black life in the rural Ohio...And yet, they overcame the obstacles and managed to persist: they got by."




