#### Dear Friends,

The month of May came in on a wet blanket but left in a blaze of sunshine that carries us into June and the glories of summer. It is the season for traveling and picnics, woodland walks and long evenings basking in sunlight. May you enjoy this time in every way possible!

The summer season does not signal an end to the ministry, study opportunities, mission projects, fellowship, and worship of our church. I hope you will read these pages carefully to find ways in which you can continue to be engaged in the life of our congregation. A worship highlight occurs on Sunday, June 11, when we will hold our annual outdoor service at Oak Hill Park. It will be a celebration of the wonders of God's natural world, and I look forward to seeing you there.

An important opportunity we have right now is to help our sister church, Westminster Presbyterian, and their pastor, Enikö Ferenczy, who is a native of Hungary. She has been on track to receive her Green Card, which would allow her permanent U.S. residency and eventual citizenship. With just a few months left in the process, the State Department suddenly changed the rules, which resulted in her being set back possibly as many as five years. This means that her ability to travel outside the U.S. is severely restricted. This summer, she was planning to visit her aging parents, whom she had not seen in ten years. Now, this is not possible, because of the risk that she might not be allowed back in the States. So, the churches in our presbytery are being asked to raise funds for her parents to travel from Hungary to Wooster.

As a gesture of goodwill toward Eniko and Westminster, I invite members of our congregation to contribute to this effort. Checks can be made out to First Presbyterian with a designation "For Enikö" in the memo line. Of course, we will be glad to receive cash, as well, and will forward all proceeds to Presbytery or directly to Enikö.

Thank you for your generous consideration of these efforts to help.

#### Pastor's Report: The Rev. David Rice

- David will be away the fourth Wednesday in June when Session is scheduled to meet. A decision was made by consensus to skip meeting in June and to meet next on July 26.
- David will be away the first Sunday in July when Communion is scheduled. David will ask Erin Guzman if she is available to preach and serve Communion on July 3. If Erin is not available, an e-vote will be taken to move Communion forward one Sunday to July 9.
- Ordination/Installation of Officers will be held during worship on June 18 to accommodate the availability of the new Officers.
- David provided an update on Rev. Enikő Ferenczy, Pastor of Westminster Presbyterian Church. Enikő's application for permanent residency in the U.S. has been delayed by as many as five years and her ability to travel internationally is restricted. She has not seen her parents, who are both nearly 80, in ten years. MVP would like to help support their travel to the U.S. while they are still able to make the trip safely. Concern was expressed about making a contribution from the church budget given FPC's current financial situation.
- **MOTION** (M. Lewellen): That Session request private contributions to a fund being raised by MVP to support the travel of Rev. Enikő Ferenczy's parents to the U.S. given Enikő's current immigration status, the age of her parents, and the long and close relationship between FPC and Westminster; 2<sup>nd</sup> (J. Webster); PASSED (u)

**General Comments**: Appreciation was expressed for all who took part in the wonderful Celebration Sunday worship service on May 21, with special thanks to Kristi Hiner, confirmation class leader, and Rachel King, children's music director.

As you know from my past communications, the RDM is exploring the possibility of selling the College Avenue Manse just north of the church. This house has served our community well over the past 50+ years with many charitable organizations calling this location "home".

Ironically, the original intent of the house was for the church pastor and their family to use while serving our congregation. In reality, the "manse model" has become dated and most new pastors coming to FPC Wooster will want to choose the house and location that best fits the needs of their families.

After many discussions over the years, the RDM has decided to take advantage of the Connections organization vacating the house and explore the possibility of selling the property. Freeing up the resources devoted to the manse will allow our congregation to:

- Eliminate the future expenses necessary to maintain the house.
- Divert our resources to further our other missions and programing.
- Reduce or eliminate the debt from the emergency replacement of our heating system last year.
- Help build up our endowment fund to ensure its health for future generations.

Over the next few weeks, you will notice that a surveyor will be placing wooden stakes around the property to mark proposed property lines. The intention is to keep the old garage in the back of the property as that is where Tim keeps the church lawn mower, gasoline, and the garden tools used to maintain our flower beds and our "Adopt a Highway" program.
