At 8:45 in the Parlor on the Sundays of November 3, 10, and 17, I will be hosting a time to explore church membership in First Presbyterian and to ask questions of me and leaders in our congregation. No reservations are necessary – just come for warm fellowship and conversation.

May this month truly be a time of thanks-giving for all the blessings we have received and those we have shared with others.

This highlight for Tower Tidings is written to update the congregation on the work of the Session in October 2024.

During the Session meeting on October 23, 2024, the dates for the November and December meetings were determined: November 20, 2024 and December 18, 2024 (if needed). Session typically does not meet in December unless needed. There will be a Session meeting on Sunday, December 8 at 9:45 a.m. in the Parlor to welcome any new members who may wish to join that day. Session members honored the life of member Harry S. McClarran, who passed away on 10.17.2024. The names of volunteers for serving communion for the months January-June 2025 were collected. Youth members will begin to help serve communion also.

The Building Use Policy 2024 was reviewed, discussed and approved by Session during this meeting. Tim Hall, Donna Bye and Lisa Rumbaugh worked on the draft of this policy to update it to include current practices and new pricing.

David Rice checked with members of Session that were present this evening about their contacts with prospective new members. Discussion continued on this topic, with planning for informational sessions about membership and the date of December 8, 2024 as a specific date to welcome new members. Of course, anyone is welcome to join the church membership at any time.

Minutes from each ministry team were reviewed by Session prior to the meeting and discussed if needed. Faith and Structure, along with RDM, requested approval to purchase the necessary equipment to replace the HVAC in the lower level Fellowship Hall by the end of 2024 to avoid the price increase predicted for that equipment in 2025. Session approved the motion for the purchase of this equipment. The cost of installation will be added on to the cost of the replacement project when it is completed.

April Gamble thanked Ann Gastier for the meaningful message shared from the pulpit on October 20, 2024. She also thanked Lisa Rumbaugh for her words during the Stewardship message on that same date.

Members of Session will continue to meet on the 4th Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Please reach out to any of the Elders listed above with any questions or concerns. Positive feedback is also welcomed as this team is working diligently to listen, discern and communicate successfully. We will also need help to UN-decorate on **Sunday**, **January 5** Many hands make lighter (and quicker) work and are such a blessing!




Help "Fluff" Swags, Wreaths, and Garlands


Friday Fellowship

A Generous Response And A Successful Trip

On the first of October, Dahlia Northside Laundry Center announced they would be collecting laundry supplies for a relief effort to the victims of Hurricane Helene. Soon donations started coming in from our customers, the community, our church family, and friends. In roughly 14 days we were blessed with almost enough laundry supplies to wash 10,000 loads of laundry. We also had a need for some warm hooded sweatshirts and socks. Our community also responded with 60 sweatshirts and dozens of socks. The generosity did not stop there. A few more donors came to us with cash donations, some of it specifically given for food and gas for our crew to get there and back safely.

We were informed the day before our trip that the organization (Shower up) who we were working with in Asheville, NC was no longer needed and they were going home. They were providing showers and laundry service to victims and first responders. After a couple hours of panic and phone calls, we partnered up with Hope International working out of Burnsville, NC. We agreed to meet them at Evergreen Baptist Church in Erwin, TN. Evergreen is a distribution center for the area. Evergreen Baptist hosted us overnight and on Saturday we met up with our partners from Burnsville.

We were informed by the Burnsville group they had a makeshift road over the mountain to Burnsville and they would be happy to take some of our donations. The folks on the North Carolina side of the mountain were going to be without power for multiple months so they had built a washer/dryer trailer to get up the road and were staying to support the residents of the area.

We were then informed that there was a need for our supplies in the town of Marshall, NC and asked if we could deliver some there. Our adventure took us to Marshall after leaving some supplies with Evergreen. Once in Marshall we were greeted with a large concentration of National Guard troops who promptly unloaded us, and the coordinator of the distribution center was ecstatic to get laundry supplies. The Guard troops were looking a little down, so we handed them the few bags of candy we took with us, and they lit back up.

We asked the coordinator of the center if she had any needs we could help with. She gave us a short list, so we drove back to the Evergreen center and was loaded with the supplies needed and we went back to Marshall. The town had just been opened up so the cleanup work was beginning.

Carol and I would like to express our sincere thanks to all who donated and sent their prayers with us!

Plastic Bag recycling isn't just for plastic bags!!! This time of year you may be getting lots of those Tyvek and other plastic shipping envelopes and packages. And various retail bags, even the heavier ones, are all recyclable! Don't forget bread wrappers, plastic overwrap (like from paper towels), newspaper bags, and zip lock bags!

Even better - REUSE! - Air pillows, bubble wrap, brown packing paper, padded envelopes (with bubblewrap or recycled finely shredded paper) can be donated to Friendtique, Mission Thrift, or Goodwill for their reuse in packing sold items or to resell.

Plastic shopping bags and more can be recycled in the container next to the church office, or at Kohl's and other retailers. These are being collected by Rotary to be made into a park bench of "plastic" wood.

The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of former FPC member Linda Melenbacker who died October 21, 2024. Linda was born in Wabash, Indiana and graduated from Rittman High School. She earned a B.S. in music from Bowling Green State University. Linda was employed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture for over twenty years and retired in 2010. She supported the Medina County Raptor Center and Medina County Parks and enjoyed working out and astronomy. Linda is survived by a brother, three sisters, and many nieces and nephews.



The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of longtime member Harry McClarran who died October 17, 2024. Harry was born in Wooster and graduated from Wooster High School in 1966 and Salem College in 1970. He received a master's degree in history from Marshall University in 1971.

Harry was employed by the City of Wooster as an operator with the water pollution control plant for over 30 years. Harry most recently resided at Smithville Western Care Center.

Harry was very active in several Masonic organizations. He was also an avid historian with a particular interest in the history of Wooster, Chautauqua, and the Civil War. Harry was declared the "Official City of Wooster Historian" by former mayor Jamie Howey. He worked for decades on a pictorial history of Wooster that was published as "A Glimpse from the Front Porch and Bridge to the Past: A Photographic History of Wooster, Ohio 1808-2008".

Harry is survived by his wife Susan and several children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren.
