This highlight for Tower Tidings is written to update the congregation on the work of the Session of First Presbyterian Church. This summary will include information from the regular meeting of Session on October 22, 2025. Carol Gates was acting Clerk for this meeting. Communion for the month of November has been rescheduled for November 9, which is Youth Sunday.

Session heard a report from Tom Rumbaugh about potential renters for the lower level of the church (under Bruch Hall). There is also a group that is interested in using the kitchen on that level of the church. Faith and Structure team members and other hard-working church members continue to paint and refresh these areas to create a welcoming space for future occupants. Many thanks to the volunteers who have contributed their talents and efforts to this renovation project.

Each of the Coordinating Teams offered updates from their most recent meetings. The Faith and Worship team reported that All Saints Day is November 2, Youth Sunday; November 9 and decorating the church for Advent is November 23. Faith and Structure reported that the dishwasher in the main kitchen broke and the part to fix it has been ordered. Women's Fellowship has provided the funds to make this major repair to this vital piece of equipment. The meeting of the chairs of the coordinating teams was moved to a date in November.

As mentioned in last month's Tower Tidings, the Session continues to meet with Rev. Matt Skolnik, General Presbyter of Muskingum Valley Presbytery as we plan for the future of the church's pastoral leadership. During these meetings, we have been provided with information about the current culture and landscape of church leadership, which has changed significantly during the recent years. These are healthy conversations about what is needed by our congregation, our invaluable staff and the FPC community. Session members are putting together plans to engage all of you in significant discussions as we celebrate our strengths and envision our future together.

The next regular meeting of Session is December 3, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.

## 20 YEARS

20 Years. It's been 20 years since FPC began using a new Gathering area, kitchen, fellowship hall, office complex, youth center and more.

Those of you who've been part of this congregation for fewer than 20 years, these facilities are taken for granted.

Those of us who've been here longer than 20years ------ OH, my—What an improvement in 2005. The entrance used by most was on the east side, from the parking lot up narrow steps into an entryway. Look at the present hallway to the Parlor ---- that was where everyone gathered to put coats on hooks; back-track to the sanctuary or proceed to the parlor. Doorways for 3 offices and a small women's restroom were on the left.

Fellowship Hall was downstairs—--small --adjacent to a kitchen used mainly by Wee Care with an old dishwasher which only Rick Peterson of the congregation could operate. Compare all that to our beautiful, welcoming, spacious Gathering Area.

Think of our well used, well-equipped kitchen. The Rotary Club and its cooks use it weekly. Other local groups use the kitchen and beautiful Bruch Hall frequently.

FPC has held about 100 memorial service receptions in the past 20 years --- plus birthdays, anniversaries and other celebratory events.

The office complex is also well-designed and functional. We have fewer staff than 20 years ago, but the space has been flexible and serviceable.

The Youth Center also has undergone various transformations and uses, but is there for our Youth.


The Manse, home for the ministers, was demolished to make room for most of the addition. The front door of the Manse faced Bowman street.

Celebrate the vison of our congregation 20 years ago.



The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of Mark Beckler of Arlington, Virginia who died September 22, 2025. Mark was the son of Shirley Beckler and brother of Joel Beckler of our congregation.

Mark was born in Wooster and graduated from Wooster High School in 1988. He earned a BA in political science from the University of Chicago, a JD from the University of Akron, and four additional master's degrees.

Mark served in the U.S. Army for 28 years. Among other assignments he participated in multinational peacekeeping in Egypt and Israel, led

humanitarian relief efforts in Central America after Hurricane Mitch, and commanded an Army Combat Aviation Brigade in the Middle East. He also served as an Army Congressional Fellow and a Senior Legislative Affairs Specialist at the National Geospatial Intelligence Agency. Following retirement he worked as a Congressional Affairs Coordinator with Booz Allen Hamilton.

Mark had wide-ranging interests including cycling, skiing, diving, music, and travel. He was an accomplished cellist and semi-professional guitar player, taught scuba diving and maritime law, and was part of an archaeological team that uncovered a pre-Revolutionary War battlefield. He was an active member of the Explorers Club of Washington D.C. and the Wooster Duck Club.

Mark attended Central United Methodist Church in Arlington, Virginia. Rev. Sarah Harrison-McQueen, senior pastor at Central UMC, co-officiated with David Rice at the memorial service held at FPC on October 11, 2025.



The congregation extends its sympathy to the family of FPC member Carol Young who died on October 13, 2025. Carol was married to FPC member Chuck Young, who preceded her in death in 2018. Carol was a long-time resident of Danbury Senior Living in Wooster. She is survived by her three daughters, Natalie, Amy, and Roxanne, and several grandchildren.
