Dear Friends,

Is it my imagination or a function of aging that summers seem to be getting shorter each year? June seemed to evaporate, and the successive months followed suit. So, here we are on the cusp of Program Year 2023-24. However, looking through the pages of this newsletter gives me a renewed appreciation for the riches of worship, study, ministry, and fellowship that each program year brings.

The newness kicks off Sunday, September 10, with the celebration of Rally Day. A potluck breakfast will get us started at 9:00 a.m. and offer fellowship and introductions to the teams and committees that engage and lead the work of our church. Our 10:15 morning worship in the Sanctuary will be led by the Eventide team, who will be expanding the frequency of their Sunday evening spiritual reflection and worship times beginning September 17.

As a preamble to the weekend, Friday Fellowship makes a comeback at 11:30 a.m. on September 8, with the promise of mealtime conversation and a guest speaker. Additional times for food and fellowship this fall include First Friends dining groups, twice-a-month Wednesday's "Find Belonging at the Table," and Mixed Company.

The strong emphasis on Christian education that has always been a historic feature of First Presbyterian can be experienced as Sunday School classes for all ages begin on September 17 and in special offerings throughout the year such as book studies and Bible groups. Our youth ministry also swings into action on the 17th with the annual "Party at Paula's," followed by ongoing events and mission opportunities.

This coming weekend, September 9 and 10, brings two especially meaningful events. A memorial service for our beloved Gordon Shull will take place on Saturday the 9th at the church, with visitation at 10:00 a.m., followed by the service at 11:00 and a reception in Bruch Hall.

Sunday, September 10, is Lauren Johnson's birthday. Lauren has been making a very slow recovery this past year from a serious accident she suffered as a pedestrian hit by a car. Session members read the minutes from coordinating team meetings this month as everyone is preparing for the new program year, which will be kicked off on September 10th. Many exciting fellowship opportunities will be announced soon, including the return of Friday Fellowship! Rev. Rice reported on the changes in the Sunday evening Eventide service. Keep watching Tower Tidings and the weekly News Flash for updates. Many thanks to the Eventide planning team for their dedication to this ministry. Amy Baxstrom, Carla Hall and Rev. Rice have recently participated in two events at the College of Wooster, meeting students and welcoming them to worship at First Presbyterian Church.

The current financial status of the church was updated and discussion followed. Jeff Perkins thanked the staff and the ministry teams for their continued diligence to provide quality programming and keep costs to a minimum. Discussion also centered around the ideas presented in a book recommended by Muskingum Valley Presbytery. Elders who read the book shared key points that will be considered when financial information is communicated to the congregation.

We continue to celebrate and support the outreach of Meals for All as that volunteer team, headed by the amazing Karen James, serves meals and creates fellowship opportunities for many folks in our community. Laura Neill, chair of Personnel ministry team, reported that the annual performance evaluations for staff are almost completed. Mimi Lewellen announced that the annual Rummage Sale, organized by Women's Fellowship, will be held November 3, 2023 in Bruch Hall with Carla Hall as the leader this year.




Rally Day- Sunday September 10th

Join us for this 5 week series focusing on who Jesus was to John, and what that means for us and the world.



BOOK STUDY GROUP

You're invited to join a discussion of the book *Christ of the Celts* by J. Philip Newell on Thursday evenings from September 21 through October 12. We'll meet from 7:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. in the church library.

Newell, one of the foremost experts on Celtic spirituality and former Warden of Iona Abbey in the Western Isles of Scotland, offers a reflection on the "forgotten" Jesus, the Christ of the ancient Celtic tradition. Drawing on the gospels of Thomas and the Acts of John and early Celtic writers, Newell outlines the Celtic vision of sacred unity and harmony between God, nature and humankind, and contrasts it with more conventional Christian beliefs.

The Wooster Interfaith Justice Committee is sponsoring a screening of the film *The Letter* on Thursday, Sept. 21, 6.30 pm



Interfaith Power & Light has made available to congregations screenings of the film *The Letter*.

The documentary film (80 minutes) tells the story of the Laudato Si encyclical letter by Pope Francis seen through the eyes of frontline leaders battling the ecological crisis across continents. Featured are a climate refugee from Senegal; an environmental defender and leader in the Brazilian Amazon; a youth climate activist from India and biologists studying coral reefs in Hawaii.

> The film includes footage from their encounter with Pope Francis, alongside their personal stories and scientific findings.

According to Interfaith Power & Light, the encyclical was written for all people to read and has sparked meaningful discussions in diverse faith communities.

Published on May 24, 2015, **Laudato Si** is translated as "Praise be to you" with a subtitle "on care for our common home."

Following the screening will be an opportunity for viewers to share comments about the film.
